ATTENDANCE

This week, I will be sending out attendance reminders to parents/carers of children where their attendance is below 92%. I am very concerned with the attendance figures here at Dursley, particularly the number of children who have attendance which is less than 90%. If your child's attendance is less than 90%, this is classed as Persistently Absent.

To have attendance which is less than 90% means your child will have missed at least 10 days of school. Which does mean, in Key Stage 1, this is **10 sessions of phonics missed**. We teach 1 phonics sound a day, so that is 10 sounds!

It is really important to remember that missing school will make your child fall behind in lessons and will impact on their academic progress and achievement. It can end up a bit of a cycle too, and they are reluctant to return due to worry about what they have missed, as well as worry about re-establishing friendships after missing so many social opportunities during the school day.

When you are deciding to keep your child off school, please use the attached poster to guide your decision-making.

PARENTS EVENING

Parents evening dates are 20th and 22nd February. Please be advised that there will be no after school clubs this week. I am very conscious that Maple Class have not had their Parents Evening from October, with this in mind, we will be holding a Parents Evening for Maple Parents/Carers only in the Summer Term. More communication regarding Parents Evening will be sent out soon.

Holidays During Term Time

Whilst we realise absence through illness is unavoidable, we do have concerns about children missing school through holidays and the impact this makes on their learning. Children also need to be present for important assessments throughout the year – there are particularly important tests for Year Six and Year Two in May and Year One in June. We cannot, therefore, authorise any requests for family holidays except in exceptional circumstances. If you do need to take your child out of school for a long absence, please contact the school office for an absence request form.
