# Holidays During Term Time

Whilst we realise absence through illness is unavoidable, we do have concerns about children missing school through holidays and the impact this makes on their learning. Children also need to be present for important assessments throughout the year – there are particularly important tests for Year Six and Year Two in May and Year One in June. <u>We cannot, therefore, authorise</u> any requests for family holidays except in exceptional circumstances. If you do need to take your child out of school for a long absence, please contact the school office for an absence request form.



## Kindness, Respect, Responsibility, Thankfulness, Forgiveness and Perseverance in Action

#### Attendance & Achievement

If attendance drops below 95%, then absence begins to have a significant impact on achievement. Catching up after absence can be difficult – this period can last as long as the absence itself. 95% attendance means around 10 days out of school in a year. 90% attendance means:

- 1/2 day absent each week
- 4 weeks absent each year
- ½ year absent over 5 school years

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. <u>Evidence</u> shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best results.
